Inside the Issue



The same level of discipline and behavior maintained in schools is expected on the school bus. Student behavior on the bus is under the driver's control at all times. The bus driver is authorized to assign seats. Upon entering the bus, the student is to be seated and remain seated during the entire time the bus is in motion. Passengers on the bus will refrain from any behavior which is detrimental to the safe operation of the school bus, such as: loud talking, screaming, laughing, or profane or obscene language as well as eating and drinking on the bus.

The use or possession of tobacco products, drugs, drug paraphernalia, or alcohol.
willful or careless damage to the bus or contents (The student must pay for damages).
Objects must not be thrown inside the bus or out the window. Any object thrown out of the bus window may result in criminal charges and/or loss of bus riding privileges, as well as fighting or slapping others is prohibited.

No part of the body may be extended out the bus window.

Combustible or flammable materials are not to be carried on the bus (cigarette lighters) or anything else that would distract the driver or result in a poor public image. Video cameras are used to observe student behavior.
