





Education Class Conducts Socratic Seminar

The Virginia Teachers for Tomorrow class fosters student interest, understanding, and appreciation of the teaching profession and allows junior and senior students to explore careers in education. As part of the course competencies, students are asked to analyze the differences between schools, the governance of schools, the role of the teacher, and the influences on student learning.

To learn this, students have been reviewing historical and current events and policies in education, the structure of national and state educational systems, and the differences between types of schooling and educational philosophy. In this context, Patrick County's Teachers for Tomorrow class had the opportunity to visit the Piedmont Governor's school on the Patrick Henry Community College campus. The Piedmont Governor's school is a science and math academy serving Henry County, Danville City, Martinsville City, and Pittsylvania County. The Governor's school mission is to provide a challenging, project-driven, and research-based curriculum.

Following the field trip and classroom content, students reflected on their learning and experience using the Socratic seminar method. A Socratic seminar is a formal discussion in which the facilitator asks open-ended questions. Within the context of the discussion, students listen closely to the comments of others, thinking critically for themselves, and articulate their own thoughts and their responses to the thoughts of others.

During the Socratic seminar, students discussed the similarities and differences between the Piedmont Governor's school and Patrick County High School, teacher qualities that make learning successful, the oversight and governance of different schools, and the recent success of Patrick County Schools. The class is taught by Family and Consumer Sciences faculty member Rebecca Renegar.

School Bus Behavior

The same level of discipline and behavior maintained in schools is expected on the school bus. Student behavior on the bus is under the driver's control at all times. The bus driver is authorized to assign seats. Upon entering the bus, the student is to be seated and remain seated during the entire time the bus is in motion. Passengers on the bus will refrain from any behavior which is detrimental to the safe operation of the school bus, such as:

- loud talking, screaming, laughing, or profane or obscene language.
- eating and drinking on the bus.
- the use or possession of tobacco products, drugs, drug paraphernalia, or alcohol.
- willful or careless damage to the bus or contents (The student must pay for damages).
- objects must not be thrown inside the bus or out the window. Any object thrown out of the bus window may result in criminal charges and/or loss of bus riding privileges.
- fighting or slapping others.
- no part of the body may be extended out the bus window.
- combustible or flammable materials are not to be carried on the bus (cigarette lighters).
- or anything else that would distract the driver or result in a poor public image.

Video cameras are used to observe student behavior.
