## 2016 Spring Track and Field

The PCHS Track Team ended the season with excellent performances at the Virginia 3A State Meet. Our goal coming in to the meet was to compete aggressively and two individuals and two relays earn first team All-State honors. Our kids surpassed our expectations, as we had 4 first team All-State performances and several PRs.

Lexy Carico placed 4th in the discus to earn first team All-State honors. To place that high as a sophomore is very impressive and indicative of a bright future. Emma Hubbard put an exclamation point on her high school career by placing 5th and earning All-State honors in a very strong 800m race.

The PCHS foursome of Armonte Carter, Emma Hubbard, Lindsey Marshall, and Autumn Hubbard earned All-State honors in the $4 \times 800$ and $4 \times 400$ relay at the 3 A State meet in June. The girls ran an incredibly gritty race in both events.

The girls $4 \times 800$ had a monster day on the track. They smashed the previous school record by 7 seconds, running 10:00.5 to place 5th in a stacked race. Armonte went out aggressively, which set the tone for the whole race. Lindsey and Autumn were extremely solid in the middle, both running big PRs. Emma closed hard and reeled in several teams, including one in the final 50 meters, to secure 5 th place and be named All-State. The girls $4 \times 400$ came in 8 th place and really worked together as a team. We are extremely proud of them.

One hundred and three teams were represented at this year's 3A State Meet, and our girls' team finished in 11th place overall with 14 points. Track and field is typically a numbers game, but what we lack in quantity, we more than make up for in quality. Our athletes came into the state meet ready to perform, and they certainly did not disappoint. We had a great year and are already looking forward to the 2017 track season!

Math $360^{\circ}$ is an initiative in math classrooms across the United States that encourages and fosters active learning for students. White boards encompass the classroom, so students are up, out of their seats and engaged in the activity. The benefit to this classroom style is that students take ownership in their work while the teacher observes their efforts and provides immediate feedback for enhanced student growth. Along with the white boards, PCPS is using our classroom as an experiment to test new flexible seating to inspire students to collaborate with their peers on a daily basis. These chairs have been well received by the students at PCHS. Students have been able to quickly move to work with other students in small groups and stations. I am excited to share this new experience with my students as well as the faculty and staff at PCHS. Hopefully, more classrooms will be able to have this awesome flexible seating in the future.

## School Bus Policy:

All students riding the bus must follow the instructions of the bus driver. Bus drivers have the authority and the responsibility to supervise the behavior of students while on the bus in order to ensure safe transportation. Failure of students to follow bus rules and the authority of the bus driver will result in a loss of riding privilege. The school bus, and the area in which students wait for the school bus, is considered as an extension of the school grounds. Therefore, from the time students arrive at or leave the bus stop and arrive at or leave school, they are considered under the authority of school officials and must adhere to all rules.

The same level of discipline and behavior maintained in schools is expected on the school bus. Student behavior on the bus is under the driver's control at all times. The bus driver is authorized to assign seats. Upon entering the bus, the student is to be seated and remain seated during the entire time the bus is in motion. Passengers on the bus will refrain from any behavior which is detrimental to the safe operation of the school bus, such as:

- Loud talking, screaming, laughing, or profane or obscene language
- Eating or drinking on the bus
- The use or possession of tobacco products, drugs, drug paraphernalia, or alcohol
- Willful or careless damage to the bus or contents (The student must pay for damage.)
- Objects must not be thrown inside the bus or out the window. Any object thrown outside the bus will result in losing riding privileges for ten days
- Fighting or slapping others
- No part of the body may be extended out the bus window
- Combustible or flammable materials are not to be carried on the bus (cigarette lighters)
- Or anything else that would distract the driver or result in a poor public image
