Cyber Bullying

What is Cyber Bullying? Basically, it falls into three categories. The first, flaming, is the posting of derogatory remarks on someone else's webpage or texting nasty remarks to someone. The best way to deal with flaming is to ignore it. The second, impersonation, is when a person logs into someone else's account and sends out messages pretending to be that user. This is a form of identity theft and is a federal crime. The last, bad mouthing, includes creating profiles that make fun of another person, erecting blogs that rate people in your class, or creating home pages that make fun of others. Authorities can take this very seriously. There are many cases of mean comments or even excessive profanity on Twitter and Facebook leading to expulsion from school. Any student who is or has been a victim of any bullying behavior needs to report it to a guidance counselor, teacher, or administrator.

Student Parking / Driving Regulations

Students are permitted to drive an automobile to school as a privilege. Vehicles will be registered with Ms. Jessup. All Vehicles will display the student parking pass and be parked in the designated parking area. Students will not park in any of the areas designated for faculty/staff parking. Tickets will be issued to violators of handicapped parking. The parking lot is off limits to students during the school day unless they are arriving at school late or leaving school early. Any student in the parking lot without a pass/authorization will be cited for loitering and skipping. Students who violate published parking regulations that are issued at the time of registration will have their parking privileges revoked. Violation of student parking/driving regulations will result in disciplinary action or loss of driving privileges for the remainder of the year. *The school grounds speed limit is 10 mph*.
