## Online Course Selection

- Log in to the PowerSchool Student Portal (patrick.powerschool.com). Emails with students' usernames and passwords will be sent out prior to course selection.
- Choose "Class Registration" from the Navigation menu on the left side

- At the top of your course selection worksheet you will see a section titled "Required Courses". Personal Finance must be taken by all 11th grade students and is already chosen for you. (If you took Personal Finance in the 10th grade, you will need to see your counselor to select your courses.)
- English and Social Studies core areas will require you to choose a course level. The required courses, combined with your elective courses, will make up your 8 classes ( 4 in the fall, 4 in the spring).

## AP Course Policy

- Our AP courses are offered in an online format through Virtual Virginia. PSAT scores are a good indicator of potential success.
- Availability of course offerings and enrollment is determined by Virtual Virginia. Spring enrollment in Virtual VA will be March 15th
- Schedule changes may limit availability
- Students are required to take the AP exam
- AP exam fees will apply to all AP courses (\$97 per exam). If a student scores a 3 or higher on the exam, the fee will be reimbursed. All fees are due at the time of summer registration day.

## Program

- Associate Degree in General Studies by the end of students' senior year in high school
- Tuition FREE college coursework
- Must complete Trigonometry and Spanish III by the end of $10^{\text {th }}$ grade (recommended to also take Personal Finance in the $10^{\text {th }}$ grade)
- Must have a 3.0 GPA or higher


## Remember

- Check graduation requirements
- Check verified credits (passed SOLs)
- Choose 8 classes and 3 alternates - alternates are important!
- Complete any necessary course applications/auditions
- Make sure you meet course pre-requisites before signing up
- Schedules will go live in PowerSchool portals in July
- Think of college/job requirements
- Complete worksheet and use to complete online course selection
- DEADLINE: All course requests must be complete and submitted by Wednesday March 1st.
