SCHOOL BUS BEHAVIOR

The same level of discipline and behavior maintained in schools is expected on the school bus. Student behavior on the bus is under the driver's control at all times. The bus driver is authorized to assign seats. Upon entering the bus, the student is to be seated and remain seated during the entire time the bus is in motion. Passengers on the bus will refrain from any behavior which is detrimental to the safe operation of the school bus, such as:

- loud talking, screaming, laughing, or profane or obscene language.
- eating and drinking on the bus.
- the use or possession of tobacco products, drugs, drug paraphernalia, or alcohol.
- willful or careless damage to the bus or contents (The student must pay for damages).
- objects must not be thrown inside the bus or out the window. Any object thrown out of the bus window may result in criminal charges and/or loss of bus riding privileges.
- fighting or slapping others.
- no part of the body may be extended out the bus window.
- combustible or flammable materials are not to be carried on the bus (cigarette lighters).
- or anything else that would distract the driver or result in a poor public image. Video cameras are used to observe student behavior.



He started in high school and became a standout star on the team. He went on to play at Temple in college where he became a team captain and was elected Offensive Lineman of the Year in each of his last two seasons. Varsity Cougar Golf

The Patrick County High School Varsity Golf team finished its 2018 season on Monday, September 17 at the 3A West Regional Tournament at Draper Valley Golf Course in Draper, Virginia.

After finishing third in the regular season, the Cougars rallied to finish a close second in the Piedmont District Tournament by only two strokes to Franklin County.

The cougars then traveled to the regional competition a short four days later. The team brought home fourth place in the region out of eight schools with an additional array of individual players whose teams did not qualify for competition.

Senior Jarrod Burnette was named to First Team All Region. Jarrod narrowly missed participation in the state tournament in a one-hole play-off.

Senior Daniel Smith was named to the Second Team All Region.

Middle School Golf takes Piedmont District Title

The Patrick County Middle School Golf team completed their 2018 season Thursday at Willow Creek Golf Course in Franklin County. The young cougar team won five out of six district matches this season competing against the Franklin County, Halifax County and Martinsville teams each match.

The victory Thursday night also sealed the Piedmont District title for Patrick County with a twenty-five stroke lead over Halifax County. Each match during the season was extremely close with one match ending in only a one stroke difference.

The title for the golf team is especially important as it is the first district title for Patrick County since the inception of the middle school sports program.


